The deacons are working with Neelsville Presbyterian Church (NPC) and Christ Presbyterian Church (CPC) in Germantown to help a recently arrived Afghan family settle in Maryland. Dale Orwig met the family in late July, and joined an ESL team to help the husband and wife improve their English. Missionaries of the Month

Shady Grove Pregnancy Center

Shady Grove Pregnancy Center is a faith based, nonprofit organization that assists anyone who finds themselves in an unexpected pregnancy. We covet your prayers during this time. Please pray for more pregnant women to call our center for assistance, especially those considering abortion. Many women and young girls believe that abortion is their only option and we believe that if we come alongside them in their crisis, we can caringly show them there is another way for them to resolve what they are facing. *At this time, we find ourselves in need of a few more women who are passionate about our mission, the sanctity of life and who genuinely enjoy helping others to volunteer as pregnancy counselors.* A volunteer counselor is someone who directly interacts with our clients. Pregnancy counselors answer inbound calls from potential clients, create appointments in our online software, conduct our self-administered pregnancy tests and most importantly, counsel women on their pregnancy options. This includes going over fetal development, parenting, adoption, and the risks of abortion. We discuss abortion for one reason: to meet a pregnant woman where she is. The women who come to us are considering abortion and by our volunteer counselors compassionately opening up this topic, we can help her explore her feelings, and walk through her obstacles to parenting. It is our desire to paint a picture of what her life could look like if she decides to carry her baby; and it is our hope that by making her aware of the support and material resources she has in this crisis, she will do just that...This is a commitment of one 4-hour shift per week for one year. We provide full training that culminates in trainees shadowing experienced volunteer counselors during phone calls and appointments. This is a deeply fulfilling, special opportunity for all our volunteers and we welcome you to apply!

We are also seeking a RDMS Sonographer to perform limited obstetrical ultrasounds for our clients. This service is crucial to our mission as it showcases the viability of the pregnancy and how many weeks along the client is; if a client is considering abortion, seeing her baby for the first time on the screen, and hearing its heart beat, can be a turning point for her to decide to carry. This is a part-time, paid position. If anyone is interested in these opportunities, please call Shady Grove Pregnancy Center 301-963-6223 to apply.

Scripture Reading – 1 Peter 4:12-19
