White Fields Missions Offering 2022

We have been doing a White Fields offering for missions around December for many years as a church. The White Fields Offering is an annual Shady Grove offering which raises funds to support the needs of our missionaries, both within the US and those who serve abroad, and to respond to one time needs for various ministries. Each year the missions committee prayerfully selects designees to receive a portion of the offering. This past year, Young Life Montgomery County and the Christian Business Men's Connection Maryland (an organization supporting a network of men learning to integrate work and faith), were among the ministries chosen. We were also blessed to be able to provide financial assistance to missionaries and ministries with specific needs or to help fill the gap created by financial shortfalls. Three of the ministries we would like to support this year include the Shannons in Peru (for construction of a new center), Covenant Village, and International Students Inc (Hon Lam's student ministry at Montgomery College). Our goal this year is to raise \$25,000. The drive will run from Thanksgiving through the end of January. You can give online or by writing "White Fields" in the memo line of your check. There are also envelopes labeled White Fields available at the church. You can give toward White Fields at any time of the year, but giving at this time helps the committee better prepare for how to best distribute the funds. The missions committee would like to thank you in advance for your generous gifts to the work of expanding the reach of the Gospel. Missionaries of the Month

Bert and Nancy Williams, as most of you know, are our missionaries in Uganda. They have asked me to share a few things that are recent and pertinent.

- There was a terrible Ebola crisis for most of the year, but thank God, it seems to have passed. This makes it much easier to minister without the fear of illness spreading
- The economy in Uganda is extremely bad. Prices are very high and so many of the people are out of work. It is a struggle for many to even provide their families with “daily bread”. They are asking that we pray for God’s provision for those in need. We know that God provides all needs if we simply ask Him. Also pray that local churches would help the people within their own congregations and their local communities in providing food.
- Shalom is making their plans for 2023 and they ask prayer for their activities to match their mission and vision. Financial resources are badly needed so that they can do what God has called them to do.
- Prayer is needed for New City Community Church as they search for a new pastor. There are very few pastors who are seeking new places to minister. Bert is helping their search committee and they are all praying that God will lead them to the right individual.

Bert and Nancy are so committed to Uganda and love the people there. Pray for their continued good health (after many bouts with Covid and other physical issues) and enable them to serve the people there and lead the lost to the saving knowledge of the Lord.

Family Builders, Inc.

Your long-standing support has enabled Family Builders to step into the gap to equip PCA churches to meet the challenges of raising our families in a culture that is increasingly undermining God’s perfect design of gender—male and female created differently to complete each other, a union which God has chosen to bear his image, and an image under attack by one who hates God’s image—The Evil One. In 2022, Gary wrote the 48-page mini-booklet, ***Our Daughters and the Transgender Craze: Responding with Grace and Truth***. Over 800 copies have been distributed to PCA churches.

Gary’s weekly podcast, ***Mission Focused Men for Christ*** continues to equip men. The fall series, ***Protecting Our Families from Enticing but False Worldviews***, contained episodes like, **Preventing Social Media from Catechizing Our Kids**, and **Progressive Christianity is Deceiving Our Kids**. It responded to false ideas of the culture like, “science has disproved Christianity,” “the modern exaltation of the SELF,” “modern views of sex are more enlightened

than the Bible,” God continues to bless the podcast/blog. 58,771 episodes were downloaded in 2022. **Thank you for your financial support, which makes this impact possible!**

All: “Are you the one who is to come, or shall we look for another?” ²⁰ And when the men had come to him, they said, “John the Baptist has sent us to you, saying, ‘Are you the one who is to come, or shall we look for another?’”

Responsive Scripture Reading - Luke 7:36–50

Leader: One of the Pharisees asked him to eat with him, and he went into the Pharisee's house and reclined at table. ³⁷ And behold, a woman of the city, who was a sinner, when she learned that he was reclining at table in the Pharisee's house, brought an alabaster flask of ointment, ³⁸ and standing behind him at his feet, weeping, she began to wet his feet with her tears and wiped them with the hair of her head and kissed his feet and anointed them with the ointment. ³⁹ Now when the Pharisee who had invited him saw this, he said to himself,

All: "If this man were a prophet, he would have known who and what sort of woman this is who is touching him, for she is a sinner."

Leader: And Jesus answering said to him, "Simon, I have something to say to you." And he answered,

All: "Say it, Teacher."

Leader: "A certain moneylender had two debtors. One owed five hundred denarii, and the other fifty. ⁴² When they could not pay, he cancelled the debt of both. Now which of them will love him more?" ⁴³ Simon answered,

All: "The one, I suppose, for whom he cancelled the larger debt."

Leader: And he said to him, "You have judged rightly." ⁴⁴ Then turning toward the woman he said to Simon, "Do you see this woman? I entered your house; you gave me no water for my feet, but she has wet my feet with her tears and wiped them with her hair. ⁴⁵ You gave me no kiss, but from the time I came in she has not ceased to kiss my feet. ⁴⁶ You did not anoint my head with oil, but she has anointed my feet with ointment. ⁴⁷ Therefore I tell you, her sins, which are many, are forgiven—for she loved much. But he who is forgiven little, loves little." ⁴⁸ And he said to her, "Your sins are forgiven." ⁴⁹ Then those who were at table with him began to say among themselves,

All: "Who is this, who even forgives sins?"

Leader: And he said to the woman, "Your faith has saved you; go in peace."

Scripture Reading – Mark 5:21-43

And when Jesus had crossed again in the boat to the other side, a great crowd gathered about him, and he was beside the sea. ²² Then came one of the rulers of the synagogue, Jairus by name, and seeing him, he fell at his feet ²³ and implored him earnestly, saying, “My little daughter is at the point of death. Come and lay your hands on her, so that she may be made well and live.” ²⁴ And he went with him. And a great crowd followed him and thronged about him. ²⁵ And there was a woman who had had a discharge of blood for twelve years, ²⁶ and who had suffered much under many physicians, and had spent all that she had, and was no better but rather grew worse. ²⁷ She had heard the reports about Jesus and came up behind him in the crowd and touched his garment. ²⁸ For she said, “If I touch even his garments, I will be made well.” ²⁹ And immediately the flow of blood dried up, and she felt in her body that she was healed of her disease. ³⁰ And Jesus, perceiving in himself that power had gone out from him, immediately turned about in the crowd and said, “Who touched my garments?” ³¹ And his disciples said to him, “You see the crowd pressing around you, and yet you say, ‘Who touched me?’” ³² And he looked around to see who had done it. ³³ But the woman, knowing what had happened to her, came in fear and trembling and fell down before him and told him the whole truth. ³⁴ And he said to her, “Daughter, your faith has made you well; go in peace, and be healed of your disease.” ³⁵ While he was still speaking, there came from the ruler's house some who said, “Your daughter is dead. Why trouble the Teacher any further?” ³⁶ But overhearing what they said, Jesus said to the ruler of the synagogue, “Do not fear, only believe.” ³⁷ And he allowed no one to follow him except Peter and James and John the brother of James. ³⁸ They came to the house of the ruler of the synagogue, and Jesus saw a commotion, people weeping and wailing loudly. ³⁹ And when he had entered, he said to them, “Why are you making a commotion and weeping? The child is not dead but sleeping.” ⁴⁰ And they laughed at him. But he put them all outside and took the child's father and mother and those who were with him and went in where the child was. ⁴¹ Taking her by the hand he said to her, “Talitha cumi,” which means, “Little girl, I say to you, arise.” ⁴² And immediately the girl got up and began walking (for she was twelve years of age), and they were immediately overcome with amazement. ⁴³ And he strictly charged them that no one should know this, and told them to give her something to eat.
